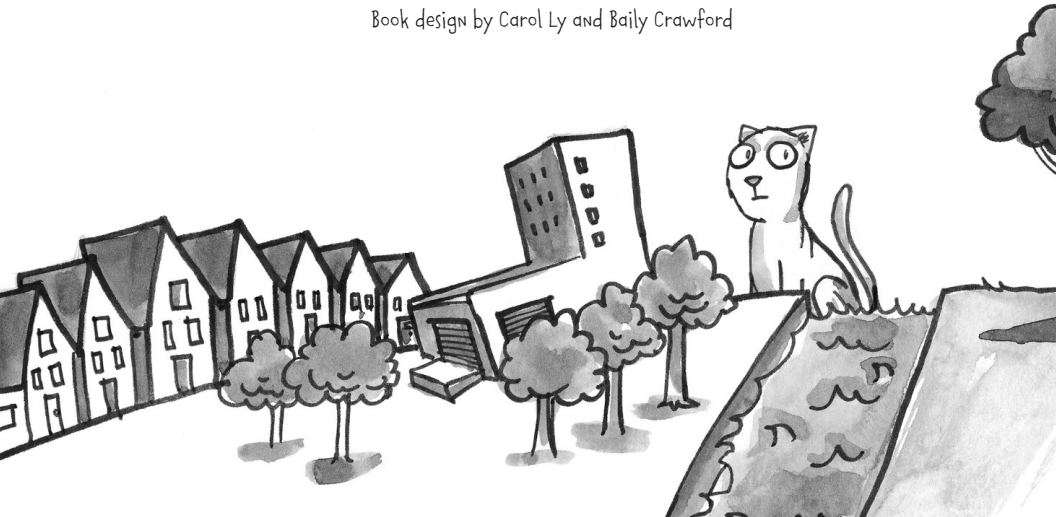

in a secret spot. ~)



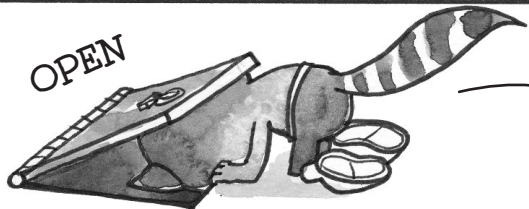
