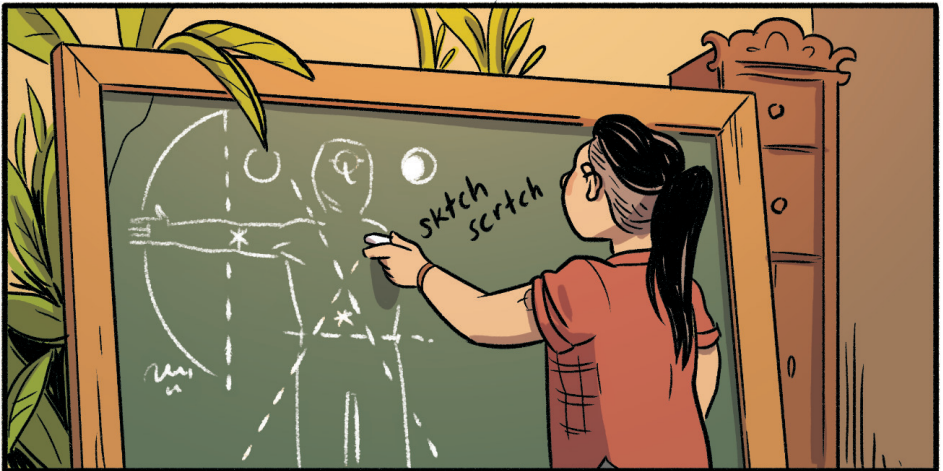
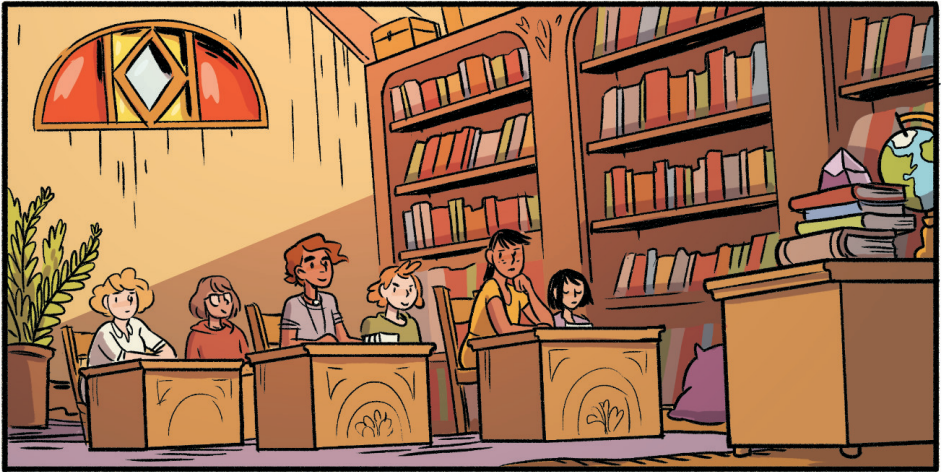

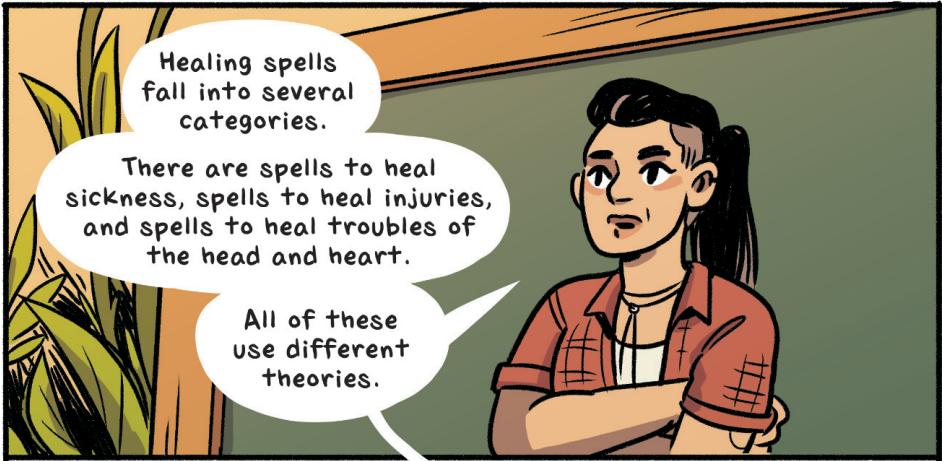

There are spells to heal sickness, spells to heal injuries, and spells to heal troubles of the head and heart.

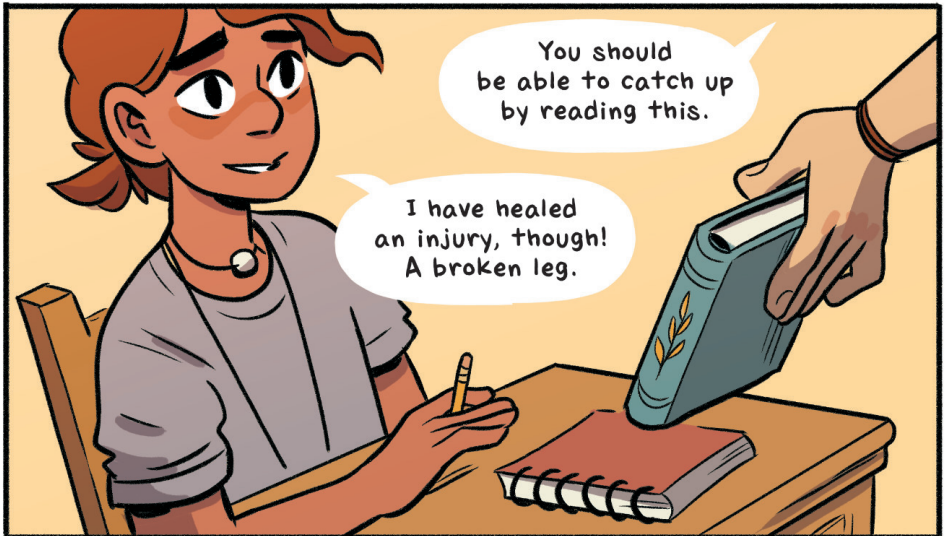
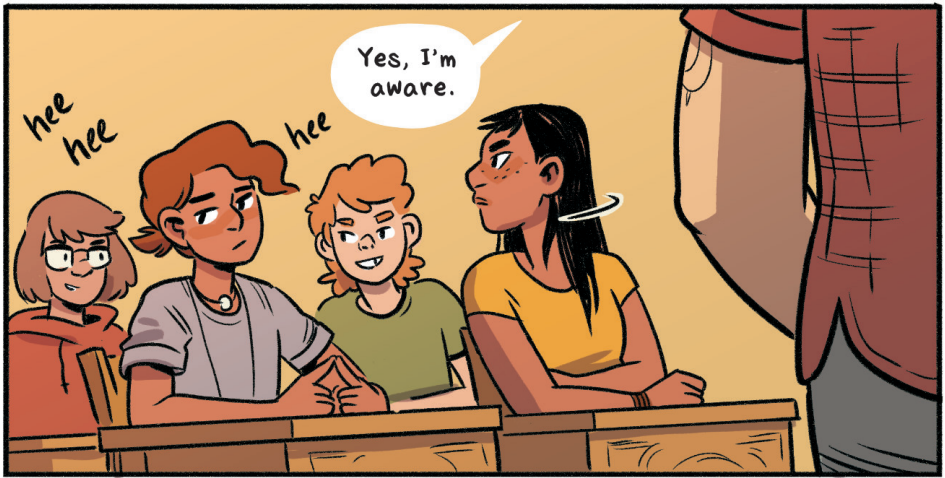
All of these use different theories.



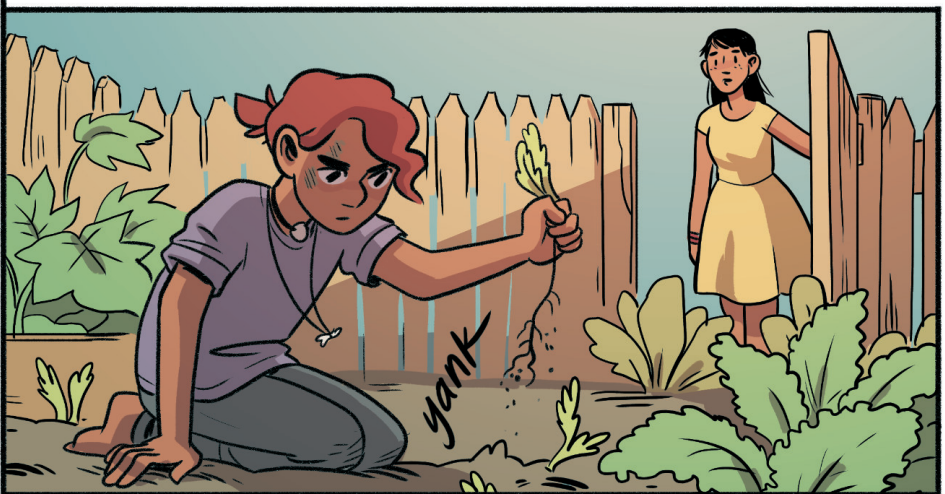
Healing sickness in humans is very similar to healing it in plants, which we've already discussed.

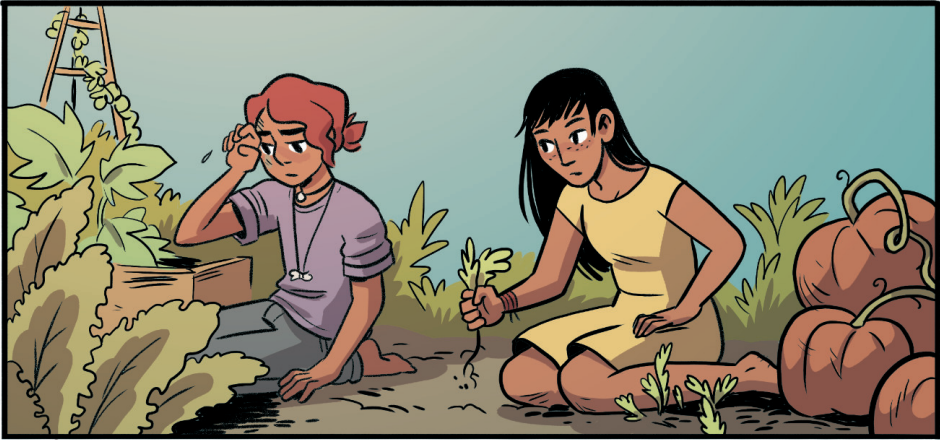
